When the teens gave their report at church on how the outreach went, it was a joy to hear them say that the trip had helped them in sharing the Gospel even in their own spheres of influence back home as a direct result of their training for this time of ministry.

Our open-air staff in the war-torn nation of Ukraine are being used of God to help families of the military. Their moral trauma runs very deep, but God can heal them of their spiritual wounds and give them the joy of life again. Hundreds of meetings have taken place coupled with counseling, showing empathy, praying with the lost and, of course, sharing Christ as the ultimate conqueror over sin and death. As a military chaplain, OAC staff man Anatoly Kushnirchuk has much work to do. New soldiers are constantly coming into the military service, and they are asking questions about God, which rarely happens in civilian life. But on the frontline, they are open to talk, to ask and even to pray to God for the first time in their lives. There are also those soldiers who have already believed in God and are eager to talk about Him, study the Bible and share their faith. Summer camps are held for the children and



are being used by God. Every night during these times of outreach, there is great opportunity to talk directly about salvation, faith in God and forgiveness of sins. There were about 100 children in our programs each day who heard the pure Gospel, and at the end of the camp, most all of them came to the place where they called to receive Christ. Thanks be to God.
